

We would therefore like to welcome all teams participating in this year's tournament and we are confident that we will have a well organised event.



IN NUMBERS

This year's competition is another chance for the region's top teams to come together and compete, with not just a magnificent trophy on offer, but also the chance to advance to the TotalEnergies CAF Women's Champions League later in the year.

We round up all the numbers on the competition!

1

The winner of this year's tournament will advance to the continental finals that are scheduled to be played in Morocco late in the year. There is only one slot for COSAFSA teams.

1

There will just be one venue used for the competition this year, the Sugar Ray Xulu Stadium in Clermont.

2

This will be the second year of the championship, with Mamelodi Sundowns the inaugural champions in 2021. They went on to lift the TotalEnergies CAF Women's Champions League later in the year.

2

The teams will be split into two groups, with only the winner advancing to the final. The second place teams will contest for the bronze medal.

3

The number of goals Mamelodi Sundowns scored in the final last year as they beat Black Rhino Queens 3-0 in the decider.

3

Three of the teams competing in the competition this year reached the semifinals in 2021. That is Mamelodi Sundowns, Green Buffaloes and Double Action Ladies. The fourth, Black Rhino Queens, could not compete due to Zimbabwe's FIFA suspension.

4

Mamelodi Sundowns only scored four goals in five games at the 2021 TotalEnergies CAF Women's Champions League but it was enough to lift the trophy as they did not concede a single one.

The most goals scored in a single game last year was seven as Mamelodi Sundowns defeated Manzini Wanderers 6-1.

There will be eight games played in the competition in Durban, six in the round-robin, the bronze-medal match and the final.

22

Mamelodi Sundowns scored 18 goals in their three group games last year, with six in each. They had 22 in five matches at the end of the competition, conceding only once.

The number of goals scored in the 12 games last year, an average of 3.5 per game!

QUICK GUIDE:

Mozambique side Costa do Sol will be making their debut at the HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League in 2022 and will provide something of an unknown quantity for their opponents.

The club is also known for his basketball programme, but they have made great strikes in recent years with their women's football side.

It is a young group of players with many aged 21 or younger, and the club is a regular supplier of talent to the Mozambique women's national team.

Many of them have been regular visitors to the COSAFA Women's Championship over the years, including striker Ninika and midfielder Goia.

Most of their team are from Maputo, though they have also had young 15-year-old goalkeeper Malaika in their squad this past season. She was born in Johannesburg and will turn 16 the day after this year's COSAFA Women's Champions League final.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"It is a given fact that we will face the champions, that is the reality. We will work to counter Sundowns' favourites tag. I am aware that playing with the best, we will learn and grow as a team.

"It was good that our paths cross on the first matchday, football is made of surprises, and everything is possible!

"We are prepared and without fear of our adversary, but of course we have respect for the African champions. The motivation is great and the girls are determined."

QUICK GUIDE:

Double Action Ladies make a return to the HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League having reached the semifinals in the inaugural year in 2021. On that occasion they were a replacement for Prisons XI and excelled in finishing second in their pool. They had seven members of their squad in the recent Botswana squad at the 2022 Women's Africa Cup of Nations in Morocco, where The Mares reached the quarterfinals for the first time in their history. They will be no pushovers and better off for their 2021 experience.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"We have been preparing for almost two weeks, though we have a few knocks in the squad, which is a bit of a concern. But otherwise the preparations are going well. "The girls are looking good, this will be our second time in Durban and when you play year-after-year in the same tournament, that gives you experience and an idea of what to expect. I think the fact that we were there in 2021 has already boosted us in terms of how we prepare the team.

"At the same time we are boosted by the fact that five of our girls have been in the national team in Morocco at the Wafcon, where they did so well.

"We believe as a team that we are ready. We don't know much about Costa do Sol, but we know a lot about Mamelodi Sundowns.

"We are very happy that everything is going well, we will take everyone head on. We can't complain about anything. We are ready to go."

QUICK GUIDE:

Green Buffaloes Women's Football Club return for the second year running to the HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League having reached the semifinals last year and shown all their quality.

They have set their sights on qualifying for the TotalEnergies CAF Women's Champions League to be played in Morocco later this year and have cause for optimism, with a number of players from the Zambia squad that won bronze at the recent Women's Africa Cup of Nations.

They were perhaps the one team to run Mamelodi Sundowns close in last year's competition and they have no doubt improved since then.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"We have pretty much the same squad as last year, there are maybe two or three changes. So there is good continuity there for us and that is important because these girls now know the level that is required. We had a good season at home and were champions again. I would say the performance was quite good, we also suffered a lot as most of the teams we play against have improved and our strike force did not perform as expected. It was certainly not easy. It is a fair group, we are meeting these teams for the first time, not knowing the level they are at. So that will be a challenge because it makes it hard to plan for them. We just have to make sure we are ready as a team to execute our plans. "Though we have a big obstacle in front of us in Mamelodi Sundowns, we have to be positive if we play against them. We met them in the semifinals last year and we saw how good those girls are. "We will have to put all our energies in to beating them, have maximum concentration and work hard. They are a very good team, well organised, but we have to believe we can win."

QUICK GUIDE:

Mamelodi Sundowns Ladies will be back to defend their HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League title in in 2022 having lifted the inaugural trophy in barnstorming fashion last year.

From there they went on to claim the continental crown after winning the 2021

TotalEnergies CAF Women's Champions League that was played in Egypt, becoming the first team to take that title too.

They will be among the heavy favourites again having defended their South African domestic championship and will no doubt be the team to beat in Durban.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"This is a very tricky draw for us because we find ourselves in a group that has a debutant from Mozambique. We have never had a chance to assess their strengths and they will be our opponents in the first game.

"We have to rely on our strengths as a team because we believe in our philosophy and playing style that has earned us great success over the years. "Yes, we came out on top last year against our opponents, but they may have changed a number of their personnel and players. I believe they have bolstered their team and I expect a different squad this time around.

"We are not going to be complacent because we plan to work hard and treat each game as a final. Defending our titles is the priority and we are ready for it."

QUICK GUIDE:

Olympique de Moroni from Comoros will be hoping to make waves when they compete in the HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League 2022.

This will be the first time that a women's club from the Comoros takes part in an international competition and the representatives of the Indian Ocean region are not coming to Durban to make up the numbers.

Olympique de Moroni is coached by Hamada Jambay. He played in Ligue 1 in France with Olympique de Marseille and also wore the colours of the French national team in the youth categories, before opting for the Malagasy senior national team selection later on in his career, which included an appearance in the 2003 COSAFA Cup.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"It is a chance to participate in this competition and it shows that Comorian football is growing. We will try our best and will use every resource we have to put our opponents in difficulty.

"We know that we are going to face experienced clubs. But we will fight to get first or second place.

"We do not have a lot of experience because the creation of the club dates back to 2019. However, we have a president who does not hesitate to put every resource to make the club progress."

QUICK GUIDE:

Young Buffaloes were the runaway winners of the Eswatini Women's Football League to earn their place at the HOLLYWOODBETS COSAFA Women's Champions League for the first time.

They are led by experienced tactician Fisiwe Hlophe, a former striker with the women's national team who later went on to coach the side as well.

Young Buffaloes as a club also has a successful men's team that won the domestic league title as recently as 2020.

WHAT THEY SAY:

"I always train my players to go forward and try to score. Our game is about attack and playing good football. That is how I like my side to play and we will do that at the tournament [in Durban] too. All of my players are available and putting in maximum effort. We are geared up for the tournament.

"It's a tricky draw, we have seen maybe six or seven players from Green Buffaloes in the Zambia national team [at the 2022 Women's Africa Cup of Nations], but we don't know the teams that well.

"We can obviously study them from last year [in Durban] but they could have a new team, so you cannot count on that. So that makes it difficult. It is just for us to go there and fight, to play to best and play to our system."

"I have about seven players who were in the national team, so them having gone to the COSAFA Women's Championship will help us a lot because they will know a little about the level."

MELINDA KGADIETE
MAMELODI SUNDOWNS

The top scorer at the last tournament, Kgadiete was a constant thorn in the side of the opposition with her intelligent runs and rocket shot. She caught the eye of the national team coaches through her performances and proved in the competition that she did not just have an eye for goal but is a consummate finisher. She will be back for more in 2022, where she will no doubt be one of the players to watch again.



LESEGO RADIKANYO
DOUBLE ACTION LADIES

The Botswana international was superb for Double Action Ladies in helping them to the semifinals, netting three goals along the way. Her movement and quality in the finish was a highlight and she is very much a leader in her side, as well as being a fine player for The Mares. She will be back for more this year!



ANDISIWE MGCYOI
MAMELODI SUNDOWNS

The tall and powerful Mgcoyi is a highly intelligent player who can be a wizard with the ball at her feet, not only scoring goals but also bringing others into play. She managed four goals in 2021 but might have finished with many more had she had a little bit of extra luck. She is experienced after a spell overseas and brought all of that know-how to the Sundowns side that lifted the trophy.



RUTENDO MAKORE
BLACK RHINOS QUEENS

Veteran forward Makore is no stranger to fans in the region after her excellent exploits for Zimbabwe's national team and she showed her worth in this competition despite her side finishing as runners-up. She has the power to hold off defenders and certainly knows her way to go as she won the Player of the Tournament prize in 2021.



BAMBANANI MBANE
MAMELODI SUNDOWNS

Sundowns only conceded a single goal on their way to the title and much of that had to do with the excellence of defender Mbane. She has been a rock at the back for club and country for some time now with her expert reading of the game and speed across the surface. She carried that on at the continental finals where Sundowns were just as miserly in defence.



PRECIOUS MUDYIWA
BLACK RHINOS QUEENS

The goalkeeper had a superb tournament and won the Golden Glove award for her numerous excellent stops as Black Rhinos Queens picked up the silver medal. There was nothing she could do to keep Sundowns out in the final, but she certainly played a big role in her side reaching the decider.
